#### **CONGO UPDATE**

We have received an email from our friend Ruth:

ear friends, We've been doing fine here in Brazzaville in recent days, and we were glad to join with New Park Road Baptist via zoom for Easter services. However, the situation has now changed. Mamy's mission in Sweden has decided that we need to return to Sweden as soon as there is a repatriation flight, since medical facilities here are not good, should we get seriously ill with Covid 19. The good news is that there are still only 6 deaths due to the virus here, after 5 weeks! This is very positive, although we cannot exclude the possibility that numbers might significantly increase in coming weeks. The lockdown is currently hurting more than the virus here.

We don't know when the next opportunity to leave will be – most likely with Air France who have been operating a flight every week or two. But it depends on demand. There are no commercial flights operating, and there are still a good number of expatriates here. We'd be grateful for your prayers for peace of mind in all of this, for packing up, for a

good flight option, for whatever situation awaits us in Sweden (we will probably have to be in quarantine for 2 weeks, but church folks will be looking out for us...), and of course that Covid 19 infections remain low across Africa. We hope to return to Congo after a couple of months, but of course that remains to be seen! We are going to Sweden at this point because that's where Mamy's mission is repatriating us to! However, there is also less Covid-19 there than in the UK. and we are based in a small town with less risk of infection... We can stay with our friend Tomas who is happy to share his flat with us.

We can continue to work remotely to some degree. We are praying daily for a solution for the UK and the other hard hit countries. God is working His purpose out... Blessings, Ruth
